May I remind you that the lost property container, on the playground near the demountables, is open everyday before school. The container is overflowing with jumpers and cardigans, all of which have no name on.

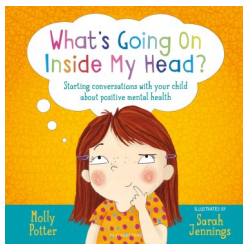
Finally, I want to share with you that yesterday we received confirmation that we have been awarded a gold award for all of the work that we do with

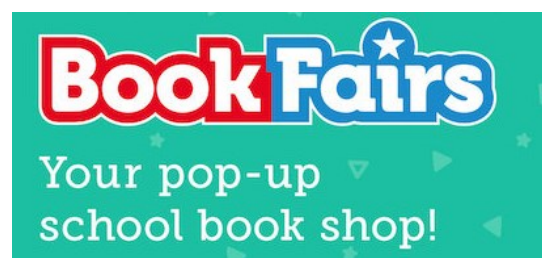


Scholastic Book Fair

Year 3 have been in full swing learning about fractions. We have made our own fraction walls and played Fraction Splash and other games to reinforce understanding. Fractions are fun!



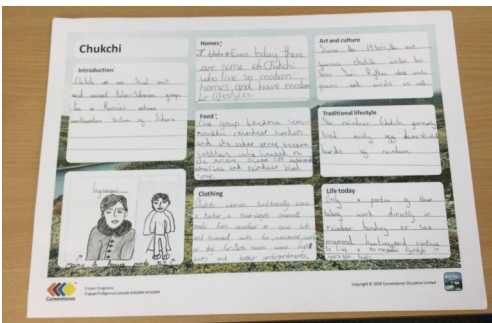
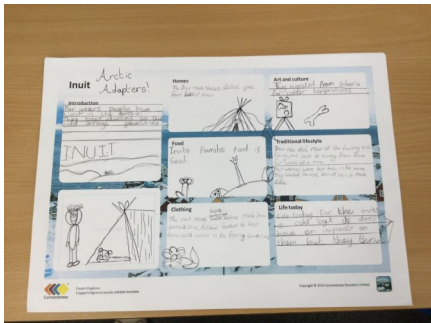
Year 5
