As partners in educating children and young people, we ask that all parents and carers to support us in talking to their children about how they behave towards others and how they can keep themselves safe outside of school and the home, both online and off.

We keep the safety of all children and young people as our highest priority and we do not tolerate any form of sexual abuse and will take any occurrence of such seriously. Our aim is to support potential victims of sexual harassment and abuse, to educate and work in collaboration with all children and young people. Ensuring sexual harassment and abuse is not part of the school culture. All disclosures will be taken seriously; **you will not be judged**. If you have been affected, please do not hesitate to contact our Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL) in our schools.

The act of sharing their story with Everyone’s Invited allows many survivors a sense of relief, catharsis, empowerment, and gives them a feeling of community and hope.

*“Rape culture is created when attitudes, behaviours and beliefs in society have the effect of normalising and trivialising sexual violence. This culture includes misogyny, rape jokes, sexual harassment, online sexual abuse (upskirting, non-consensual sharing of intimate photos, cyberflashing), and sexual coercion. When behaviours such as these are normalised this can act as a gateway to more extreme acts such as sexual assault and rape.”*


