Details of Bus access to site	<p>Ensign Bus Services: Number 22,22A,25,33,44,66,73,83, and 88 arrive and depart at Grays Bus Station at appropriate times for the school run both in the morning and afternoon. Grays bus station is a 15 minute walk away from the school. Number 66 also stops in Dock Road, which is a 3 minute walk away from the school. Numbers 83 and 73 also stop at Dock Road, Palmers Avenue and Southend Road. At the most this is a 15 minute walk away from school.</p>
